The most important years of growth in a child are between 18 months and six years. Within this time frame, your child will learn, manage and master hundreds of tasks in a progressive, systematic series of lesson plans called The Montessori Method.

Our Objective

We teach your children in such a way that they understand themselves and the world around them via concepts that build lifelong learning.

In a Montessori setting, children rule. As a result, the core difference between Montessori and traditional toddler, primary & kindergarten programs are many:

- Children are taught via a hands-on, interactive environment and are free to learn at their own pace
- Learning about oneself is based on self-building; as a result, children develop their own will, self-control, concentration, intellect, self-esteem, independence, and sense of responsibility
- Children are grouped in age ranges rather than age-specific classes
- Classrooms are communities based on students respecting other students
- Classrooms are 'children's houses' rather than 'parent's houses'
- Students are **observed and evaluated** but not issued grades
- Disciplining a child does not include a 'time out' or punishment; rather, it's all about talking out behaviors with the child

Most importantly, what the child learns in the classroom continues at home. Parents learn to let their kids do things themselves!


The Montessori approach to education is about lifelong learning. You might say it is the 'jewel in the crown' of our objectives. That's why we named our school La Jolla Montessori.

Along the way, basic milestones are achieved: potty training, dressing themselves, 'picking up and putting away,' and increasing gross and fine motor skills. During this time, we begin teaching two languages in a natural way. To do this, we use two teachers in one classroom. For example, in circle time, teachers will take turns conducting reading, stories, and songs—one day in English and the next day in Spanish. Over time, toddlers become familiar with both languages.

Growth, Learning, Understanding & Communicating With Others

Here in the Primary and Kindergarten programs are where Dr. Maria Montessori's 110 year-old teaching method shows its considerable talents as a tool for self-reliance.

As your child grows, so do our programs. Here in Primary, three to six year-old children are immersed in behaviors and lessons to help them become self-motivated, successful learners.

Bilingual teaching transitions smoothly in the primary environment since teaching began during the Toddler program. Starting with 'sandpaper' letters in both English and Spanish, students learn via sounds, feeling & sight.

Once children know their letters, writing and reading begins. Now, they begin to understand language and lessons, especia in their native tongues.

Peer learning, a core
Montessori Method tool, then
comes to the fore. A three
year-old may not be ready
for specific lessons but a
kindergartner may. So, our two
teachers pair the younger child
with the older child to help
understanding and assimilation.
In this way, younger children

emulate older children while learning to respond in everincreasing ways.

Conversely, older children become program leaders by sharing work and lessons with younger children. As a result, Year Three students become more confident because they are now capable of showing Year One kids how to undertake tasks.
